If you don't accept excuses, people stop giving them and start looking for solutions. And that is a critical issue when it comes to success. When I came to understand that I had control of my own destiny I didn't hate poverty anymore, because I knew it was only temporary.

Alexis de Tocqueville came to America to learn how a fledgling nation, barely 50 years old, could already be competing with them on virtually every level. This was impossible. He was going to sort it out. He found that anyone who had finished the 2nd grade was completely literate and could read the newspaper, have a political discussion, and tell him how the government worked. Questions extracted from a 6th-grade exit exam from the 1800s are beyond most college graduates of today. Our system of government was designed for a well-informed and educated populace. And when they become less informed, they become vulnerable.

5 doctors signed the Declaration of Independence. Lawyers learn in law school how to win. We need to start thinking about how to solve problems and care about other people. Many teachers have told us that when we put a Carson Scholar in their classroom, the GPA of the whole class goes up over the next year (carsonscholars.org). There is something inherently fair about proportionality, the basis of tithing, the Hebrew tax system. When a person is born, give him a birth certificate, an electronic medical record, and a health savings account (HSA).

There have been many stories about the bullying epidemic occurring in our public school system. We should not be surprised that children emulate what they see adults doing, especially politicians. Society works much like marriage in the sense that open communication facilitates harmony. In almost all marriages that end in divorce, there is a serious breakdown in communication followed by false assumptions and outright warfare. They usually realize that they are the ones who look like fools if they refuse to engage in problem solving. The real key to staying cool and calm is to relinquish selfishness and consider the feelings of others. Offense and sensitivity are often feigned for the purpose of garnering sympathy and reinforcing political correctness. If we say "I can see that you were deeply hurt by my choice of words. It was not my intention to hurt you and for that I am sorry. Now I would like for you to know what I intended to communicate to you and I will use different words that will hopefully convey

the spirit of my thoughts and allow our discussion to continue." If it is just a misunderstanding, often the conflict can be alleviated by this kind of open communication. But sometimes you have to realize that you cannot heal all wounds no matter how hard you try.

By creating hypersensitivity and drawing angry reactions, Alinsky's organizers' goal was to make the societal majority feel that their opinion is the minority and that theirs is the majority. The ability to coopt the mainstream media is a gigantic coup. If the majority of people who are rational, reasonable, and full of common sense feel that their opinions are out of sync with everyone else, it is easy to shut them up and beat them into submission. We have learned that isolationist policies are not a luxury to be afforded the pinnacle nation in the world. With power comes great responsibility and the need to lead rather than simply react to volatile international situations that may affect our secu-

Religious crusaders are so certain that only they can be right, that they will stop at nothing to either convert others or eliminate them. Totalitarianism always starts with restrictions on the rights of others. We must avoid them at all costs.

Thomas Jefferson said it was immoral to leave debt to the next generation. Bigotry can still be seen in the assumption by many on the Right that gays should not have access to children because they are more likely to commit rape or engage in abhorrent sexual indoctrination. If this is true it should be easy to prove statistically, but such proof has yet to be provided.

When special interest groups influence one side or the other, creating dissension, Congress doesn't work well. The primary 2 political parties have become opponents instead of teammates with different approaches to the same goal. Never before Obamacare has any major society-changing piece of legislation been passed in this country without bipartisan effort.

Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed it's the only thing that ever has. It is the natural tendency of all governments to grow and they require revenue to do so. As the rights of the government increase, those of the people decrease. First, concur on what is important to both parties. Next, determine who is harmed by each position and agree not to intentionally harm others. Last, exhibit tolerance without discarding core values.

Bribes appeal to people who feel disempowered, yet entitled. Wide-ranging curiosity and careful study will provide the background to correctly analyze words uttered by politicians and the media. What we already know influences the way we process new information. A good knowledge base avoids having to look everything up on Google and enables instant analysis of new information on an everyday basis. Ideology frequently renders one incapable of learning and instead makes its ideologues expert excuse makers, with someone or something else always to blame for the failure of their ideas. Capitalism offers a better solution, as long as personal responsibility and compassion are included.
